There is the potential to see the northern lights on the fly-drive at:

- * New Year
- * Easter
- * October

NO possibility of seeing the northern lights during the May fly-drive as the nights do not get dark.

Fly-Drive

Can we get in the interior?

The interior of Iceland is only open from late June until mid September.

How much off tarmac will there be?

There will be considerably less off tarmac than in the summer due to weather and road opening conditions.

There are varying degrees of off tarmac depnding on the fly-drive. The closer to summer more roads become open, so May and October offer the best opportunities.







Summer Expedition

Venture 4x4's 14 day summer tour is a combination of overland driving through deserts, mountain, lava fields and roads/track where only 4x4 vehicles are allowed. We also get to see some amazing sights, from waterfalls to geothermal areas including volcanoes.

What is included?

- * All Campsite fees.
- * Entrance into Myvatn blue baths.
- * Entrance into a number of attractions.
- * Expert guides/guidance.
- * A photograph book of your tour.

Is it all camping?

It is primarily camping, the reason behind is that it allows us the flexibility to camp at some very remote campsites. There is the opportunity to have hotel or guest house accommodation along the route should you want a break from camping.

Do you wild camp?

We DO NOT wild camp, this is frowned upon by the Icelandics, they are very keen on conservation, it is illegal in some locations.

How many vehicles?

We normally have 4 client vehicles, we like to keep the groups small and personal.



There are a large amount of water crossings, somewhere in the region of 200, during the summer expedition. Full instruction is given.

Can we hire a vehicle there?

You can hire a 4x4 vehicle but be mindful they are expensive during the summer.

How do we get there?

Either by ferry from north Denmark or you can container your vehicle from UK to Reykjavik and fly to meet it.

Advice and Guidance

Important information you must consider before booking.

Venture 4x4 Ltd will assist you to ensure you have a stress free holiday.

Any bookings we make on your behalf will be commission free.

We often get discounts which we pass straight on to you.

Starting point: All our Iceland expeditions and fly-drives start in Iceland where you will be met.

Driving: Off-roading in Iceland is illegal. Our summer routes only use authorised tracks that, here in the UK, would be considered as 'off-roading' including numerous water fording.

Taking your vehicle: If you use your own vehicle in Iceland you will need to ensure that apart from being road legal you also have valid insurance for the vehicle which specifically includes Iceland. Fuel (Petrol and Diesel) is readily available in Iceland with pay-at-pump facilities. You should have all your vehicle documentation as well as driver's licence.

- * Food: There are strict customs restrictions on the amount and type of foods that can be imported into Iceland. However the supermarkets are well stocked with a good range of local and European food. Fresh bread, vegetables and fruit are readily available.
- Currency: Icelandic Krona is the currency. The most major bankcards are accepted at banks and ATMs. Please notify your bank of all your travel arrangements.
- * Passports: All visitors to Iceland must be in possession of a valid passport. Visas are required for some nationalities.
- Health & Vaccination: There are no recommendations regarding vaccination and immunisation; however please consult a medical professional for further advice as required.

It is essential to appreciate that although we will encounter a large amount of 'off tarmac' driving these expeditions are not run as a race, raid or rally and that they are not a test of vehicle (or occupant) durability.

Equipment

Please make sure your vehicle has been serviced. A vehicle kit/spares list is a personal choice and a compromise between what you need and what you should take. Please also consider the legal requirements of the country(s) you may be traveling through. The following list is for reference only and should not be taken as exhaustive.

Essential: Red warning triangle (legal requirement), first aid kit, fire extinguisher, tool box, torch, and reflective vests for each occupant, spare bulbs as well as vehicle spare key(s).

Vehicle preparation: Vehicle should be equipped with a raised air-intake (snorkel), good set of AT/Mud tyres (at least one spare) and under-body protection as a minimum as well as a CB radio. A fridge is desirable.

Vehicle spares: Please contact your vehicle main dealer to discuss spares. Tie raps, duck-tape, WD40, drive belt etc. might be useful.

Fuel: A range of 400 mile and a 20 ltr spare fuel can is essential.

Recovery equipment: No special recovery equipment is needed.

Personal kit list: Waterproofs and warm clothing are essential. It is advisable to use the 'layer' systemed approach. Sturdy footware should be worn and welly boots could be useful.

Tents: Ground tent should be rated at 2 season or above. If you use a roof tent then have a ground tent as a back-up. Strong tent pegs are essential.

Sleeping bags: A good quality 3 / 4 season sleeping bag should be adequate.

Cooking facilities: Camping gas is readily available.

Storage: All kit and/or supplies should be stored in storage containers secured inside the vehicle.
